HOONKO SERVICE SUNDAY – JANUARY 20TH - 10:30 AM SERVICE WITH REVEREND JOSHIN DENNIS FUJIMOTO

Resident Minister Buddhist Temple of Alameda

Reverend Joshin Dennis Fujimoto was born in Tokyo, Japan in 1952, a member of a Jodo Shinshu Ministerial family. In 1953, his family moved to the United States. He received his BA from the University of California in Berkeley, in 1974; his MA from the Institute of Buddhist Studies in Berkeley, in 1980; his Tokudo ordination in 1981; and his Kyoshi ordination in Kyoto, Japan in 2004. He received Kaikyoshi status in 2005.



The Idaho-Oregon Buddhist Temple in Ontario, Oregon, was the first ministerial assignment for Rev. Fujimoto. He designs and creates sculptural art pieces, primarily of cast stone or metal, as the owner of Wood & Stone, and is the principal designer for The Jigokumon Collection. Since November 2018, he has been the resident minister at the Buddhist Temple of Alameda, California.

ON HIS SCULPTURES: It is my hope that my sculptures have a settling presence and exude a meditative calm. In this busy life, perhaps they can serve as a sign, a reminder to stop and breathe.

ON THE CREATIVE PROCESS: I look upon the creative process as a form of meditation. The end sculpture is a reflection on the human struggle towards enlightenment.

ON BUDDHISM: Buddhism encourages its followers to strip away the frivolous; to recognize and move away from the relative world of material gain and personal pleasure, towards an awakening to the absolute. The Buddhist life is to walk this path from relative to absolute and to help others along the way.

HOONKO SERVICE Shinran Shonin's Memorial Service SUNDAY – JANUARY 20th - 10:30 AM SERVICE

Hoon-ko commemorates the death of the founder of Shin Buddhism, Shinran Shonin. This holiday is observed in early January from the 9th to the 16th. This holiday is among the most important observed in the Jodo Shinshu tradition. The observance began after Shinran's daughter. Kakushinni carried on administration of Shinran's mausoleum, as did her descendants, who ultimately became the Monshu of Jodo Shinshu. In the word hōonkō; 'hōon' means "return of gratitude" and 'ko' means "to clarify

the meaning of" or "gathering"".
