

We are grateful for their many years of dedication to the Spokane Buddhist Temple, serving as religious leaders and Board Members, and volunteering for many fundraisers and other activities and we will miss you two. We wish you well in their new adventure.



The following is an excerpt from Minister Assistant Chad Donoho's Dharma Talk on 5/28/23, the Sunday after Reverend Opel gave her last Dharma Talk at the Spokane Buddhist Temple, before moving to San Francisco:

"Our tradition describes the world as a changeful web of causes and results. Everything is simultaneously interdependent and co-arising. All things change and pass away into new things.

Recently our Temple had quite the significant change. Reverend Melissa Opel has accomplished the goal she has been working towards for years. That is to totally dedicate herself to being a Jodo Shinshu Minister. Unfortunately, in order to achieve this, she had to take a position in San Francisco, leaving all of us to try to figure out what we're going to do now. For me, I can't think about how things are now, without thinking about how they began. Melissa and I started on this path together. It was a bit of a tumultuous time for the Temple. We had gone from having 5 minister assistants to, in a span of a few months, having only 1 and he had 1 foot out the door. So Melissa and I stepped up and fortunately Sensei Vielle came out of retirement to try to train us. It was a crazy time full of conflicting emotions: Excitement at this whole new world that was opening up to us and fear as we tried to figure out how to make this work.

Over the years it has been a continuous learning process and the only constant has been change."

We are sad that Reverend Melissa and Becca Opel have left Spokane, but also excited for them on their new assignment. The three remaining volunteer Minister Assistants: Chad Donoho, Amanda Goodwin and Eric Kerkove will continue to lead the Spokane Buddhist Temple's religious activities and provide services each Sunday. Our supervising minister, Rinban Kusunoki, from Seattle will come to Spokane several times this year to assist our team. Ask them if you have questions.


June Shotsuki-Hoyo

By joining or renewing your membership, you honor the legacy of the families and individuals who founded this Temple in 1945 and will help maintain the foundation for the future. Your membership is critical for keeping the Dharma alive in Spokane for the benefit of current and future generations.

Membership pledges are made/renewed on a yearly basis every November and can be paid in numerous ways and increments. Pledges can be paid by check, credit card, or an e-check from your financial institution. You can pay annually, semiannually, quarterly, or monthly.

Individuals who make annual pledges of \$300 or more are sustaining members of the Temple. Those contributing at lower levels are non-voting associate members of the Temple. Although \$300 is the minimum pledging amount for sustaining membership, additional pledges are greatly appreciated. It costs about \$60,000 annually to run the Temple, including: operating expenses, building upkeep, visiting minister costs, our minister's education, and dues to the Buddhist Churches of America (BCA) and the NW District. Membership pledges make up about 25-30% of our revenue, and we depend on them to be able to keep the Dharma alive in our community.
